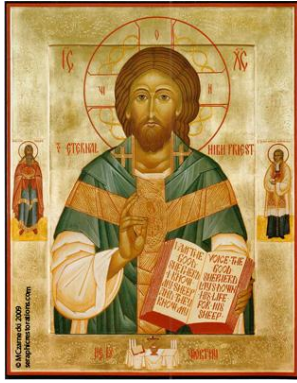

Haiti Donations

- A new law allows you to claim donations for Haitian relief on your 2009 tax return.
- To be eligible for a deduction on your 2009 tax return, donations must be made after January 11, 2010 and before March 1, 2010.
- You have the option of deducting these contributions on either your 2009 or 2010 tax return, but not both.
- Federal law requires that you keep a record of any deductible donations you make. Be sure to keep a bank record, such as a cancelled check or a receipt from the charity.
- Contact the parish office if you need a special contribution letter for your Haitian relief donations.
