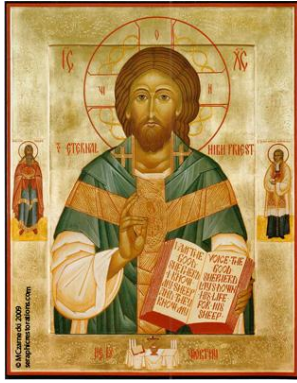

CTK HOUSING REPAIR MISSION 2010

For the past two years, Christ the King has participated in the Saint Joseph’s Housing Repair Mission program in Clintwood, Dickenson County, Virginia. We provide much needed manpower for housing repair projects for needy individuals in the region. In addition, we attend cultural and social activities and enjoy local entertainment. This program, run by Sister Jean Korkish, is designed mainly for high school and college age volunteers. Teens must be 16 years old in order to participate without being accompanied by a parent. There will be at least one adult for every 5 teens attending.

The cost for the mission is \$325 per person. We welcome donations from parish members who would like to contribute toward augmenting a young person who would like to attend. The entire CTK family has responded with great generosity in donating money, supplying food, and other supplies to help keep costs down for our previous missions. Thank you to everyone who has contributed in the past!

The dates for this year’s CTK Housing Repair Mission to Dickenson County, Virginia will be Saturday, August 7 to Saturday, August 14. We will have just one group of 25 going on the mission this year.
